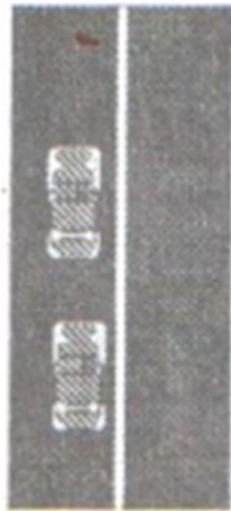


# CLASS E - CARRIAGEWAY MARKINGS

## CLASS E -> CARRIAGEWAY MARKINGS



LONGITUDINAL LINES ARE THERE TO DEMARCATATE THE CENTRE OF THE ROAD



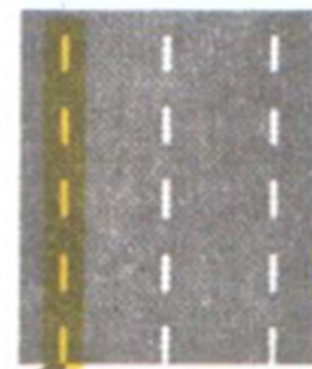
A CONTINUOUS WHITE LINE MEANS YOU MAY NOT OVERTAKE. YOU CANNOT CROSS THIS LINE BUT KEEP TO YOUR LEFT ALWAYS.



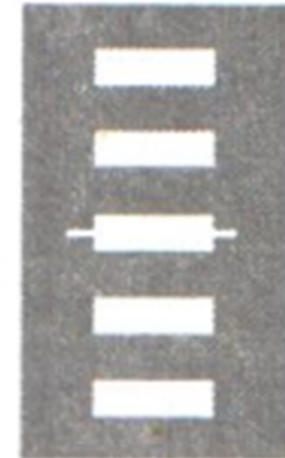
A CONTINUOUS WHITE LINE WITH A BROKEN WHITE LINE ON YOUR SIDE MEANS YOU MAY OVERTAKE AS CAR (A) DOES. BUT CAR (B) CANNOT OVERTAKE.



DOUBLE PROHIBITION LINE, NO VEHICLE MAY AT ANY TIME BE DRIVEN ON THE RIGHT HAND SIDE OF THIS LINE.



EXAMPLE: EDGE OF CARRIAGEWAY LINE- NO MOTOR VEHICLE SHALL CROSS OR STRADDLE THE YELLOW LINE EXCEPT IN ORDER TO OVERTAKE TRAFFIC WHICH IS TURNING TO THE RIGHT OR TO STOP.



PEDESTRIAN CROSSING PATTERN AT POINTS OTHER THAN ROAD INTERSECTION - ALTERNATE BLACK AND WHITE STRIPES.



DIRECTION ARROWS USED IN CONJUNCTION WITH PROHIBITION LINES HAVE A REGULATORY EFFECT.
